In Mathematics we will be focusing on:

Number and Algebra:

- Revise place value from Term 1
- Addition and subtraction (including: counting forward/back, fact families, doubles, near doubles, regrouping and renaming)

Statistics and Probability:



Friday 14th June - Tour of Yakult Factory, Dandenong South and Dandenong Market

At the Yakult factory, students will be introduced to manufacturing, food processing and packaging lines. This will be followed by a tour of Dandenong Market to explore how plants and animals are grown for food, clothing and shelter and the role of technology in this process.

Homework: Reading/ writing at home	Reading should be an enjoyable experience for all family members. Make this a special time where you and your child are not distracted. Children are to read "Just Right Books" at home, that is, books that are easy. Teachers work on more difficult, "Instructional" texts with the children at school. It is expected students will read 4-5 times a week. Take home books are provided and children are also encouraged to borrow books from the school library. Please also make use of our local library. The books read at home are be recorded into the child's Reading Log book, for teachers to check / monitor reading on Fridays. Please support your child to get into the good habit of returning take home books to school on Fridays. Writing – please provide your child with writing materials, paper, glue and scissors to use at their leisure. Practise writing shopping lists, birthday cards or notes to friends.
Nude food	All students are encouraged to bring 'nude food' lunches. A nude food lunch has no foil, gladwrap

School Uniform	Our Beaumaris PS school uniform should be worn correctly and be in good condition. Please ensure all items of clothing are named and check the lost property cupboard near the art room for any missing items. Please ensure hair longer than shoulder length is tied up and hair accessories are school colours only. Jewellery is not part of the Beaumaris PS school uniform including coloured wrist and ankle bands. Students may only wear small stud earrings. School uniform is worn on excursions. All students will require a school hat until 1st May.

Fortnightly Statements of Intent are posted on the website. Teachers will be outside their classrooms from 3.30pm-3.40pm each day so that you can informally catch up with them. If you have a specific concern, please make an appointment with the class teacher. REMINDER: All teachers are required at staff meetings and professional development sessions every Monday and Wednesday from 3.45pm so are unable to meet with you on these days. Teachers are also required at staff briefing some mornings at 8:40am. The Compass mobile app, stop press and Facebook page will also update parents on daily events and reminders.
Absences	If your child is to be absent, you can email the office on beaumaris.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au or the new link on our website and your class teacher will be alerted to their absence. If not sent through by email, we still require written verification of student absence (not in the student diary). In addition to this, any students leaving the school before 3:30pm require an early leaver's pass to be collected at the office and presented to the classroom teacher.
